

UC SAN DIEGO REGISTERED STUDENT ORGANIZATION CONSTITUTIONAL GUIDELINES

ARTICLE I. NAME OF STUDENT ORGANIZATION*

The organization shall be called HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS).

ARTICLE II. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE*

HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS) strives to establish a platform for Chinese students abroad to share their feeling for stress relief purpose, provide information that promote mental well-beings, raise attention and awareness of mental health and link Chinese students to campus mental health resources based on individual need.

ARTICLE III. NONPROFIT STATEMENT*

HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS) is a non-profit student organization.

ARTICLE IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP*

Only UCSD students are eligible for membership. Speaking and understanding Mandarin fluently is required. There are no dues required for becoming a member.

ARTICLE V. FREQUENCY OF ORGANIZATION MEETINGS*

Our Executive Board members would meet in a weekly basis. Officers would be meeting every other week. We expect the members to attend every meeting, but excused absence is given. Minutes for every meeting will be given for every member.

ARTICLE VI. QUALIFICATIONS FOR HOLDING OFFICE AND METHODS OF SELECTING AND REPLACING OFFICERS*

Only registered UCSD students may hold office in the organization. Only registered UCSD students may vote in elections for the selection of the organization's officers.

Currently, 26 officers are in HaiLuo. Officers are elected in April, and they would be fulfilling their duties until next year's April. Officers would be elected through voting from all the members of HaiLuo.

ARTICLE VII. RISK MANAGEMENT*

HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS) is a registered student organization at University of California, San Diego, but not part of the University itself.

HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS) understands that the University does not assume legal liability for the actions of the organization.

Our activities might involve international travel.

ARTICLE VII. SECTION 3. IN CASE OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

HaiLuo Mental Support (formerly CSMS) at UCSD recognizes that the University generally recommends against all international travel by Student Organizations due to the myriad of risks travelers face in foreign countries. Student organizations are discouraged from traveling to foreign countries due to the wide variety of risks involved with foreign travel, and the extensive planning efforts required by the Student Organization's Members to manage those risks. Security risks and health care services vary widely from one country to another, so thorough research on those topics is especially important.

International travelers are advised to research US State Department Travel Advisories and the CDC Travel Health site and abide by all recommended alerts and warnings, and procure travel insurance with medical coverage that covers their chosen destination because most USA Health Plans are not valid in foreign countries.
