ARTICLE I. NAME OF ORGANIZATION

The organization shall be called Figma at UC San Diego.

ARTICLE II. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

At Figma at UC San Diego, we're inspired by the idea that young people are the next generation of designers and innovators. We're building a future where every student has access to top-tier design resources and a supportive community that inspires them to create, collaborate, and innovate.

Our program mission statements are as follows:

- 1) Support and strengthen the design community on campus.
- 2) Ensure that students have access to the tools they need for success.
- 3) Empower students with the skills and knowledge they need for the future.

Our program goals are as follows:

- 1) Build a strong design community on campus.
- 2) Spread the word about Figma's tools on campus.
- 3) Ensure students take advantage of Figma's education offerings.
- 4) Increase Figma proficiency and skills on campus.

ARTICLE III. NONPROFIT STATEMENT

Figma at UC San Diego is a non-profit student organization.

ARTICLE IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP

Membership in Figma at UC San Diego is open to all currently enrolled students. We welcome students of all majors, backgrounds, and experience levels who are interested in design, innovation, and collaboration. No dues or fees are required to join or participate in club activities. All events, workshops, and programs will be provided at no cost to members.

Figma at UC San Diego does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, disability, veteran status, or any other characteristic protected by University policy or applicable law.

ARTICLE IV. SECTION 1. HAZING PREVENTION

Figma at UC San Diego is committed to maintaining a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment for all its members and does not condone hazing. Hazing, in any form, is strictly prohibited within the organization in compliance with state and federal law, Regents' policies and University regulations. Participation in hazing or any intentional, knowing, or reckless act, activity, or method committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons, including current, former, or prospective students, regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that is committed in the course of a preinitiation, an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in, an official or unofficial student organization or other student group that i. causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher

education or the organization (such as the physical preparation necessary for participation in an athletic team), of physical or psychological injury, including personal degradation or disgrace, and/or ii. the person knew or should have known was likely to cause serious bodily injury. As an organization, we understand that failure to abide by hazing policies and laws will result in referral to the Center for Student Accountability, Growth, and Education (SAGE) for an organizational violation and/or individual violation(s).

ARTICLE V. MEETINGS

Figma at UC San Diego will host a minimum of four design-related general body events each academic year and will partner with the existing student groups, leaders, and departments who are focused on design and innovation at their school. These events will be open to all UC San Diego students and will focus on building Figma skills, fostering collaboration, and strengthening the campus design community.

ARTICLE VI. QUALIFICATIONS FOR HOLDING OFFICE AND METHODS OF SELECTING AND REPLACING OFFICERS

Only registered UC San Diego students may hold office in the organization. Only registered UC San Diego students may vote in elections for the selection of the organization's officers.

Figma at UC San Diego will have four student leaders, known as Campus Leaders. Campus Leaders believe deeply in Figma's ability to make design accessible to all, and contribute to that mission by working closely with the Figma for Education team to grow the design community on campus.

Each Spring quarter, Campus Leaders will be chosen by the Figma for Education team for the following school year. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Enrollment Status: Applicants must be currently enrolled as full-time students at UC San Diego. Open to students of all years, including undergraduate and graduate students with at least a full academic year remaining.
- Passion for Design: Demonstrated interest in design, innovation, and collaboration.
- Experience using Figma: Demonstrated experience using Figma's tools.

Strong candidates for this role have:

- Campus Involvement: Active participation in campus organizations, clubs, or departments related to design, innovation, or technology.
- Leadership Skills: Proven leadership experience and the ability to mobilize and inspire peers.

ARTICLE VI. SECTION 1. REMOVAL PROCESS

Members and officers of Figma at UC San Diego may be subject to removal for the following reasons:

- Failure to fulfill the responsibilities of their role.
- Conduct that violates the organization's constitution or mission.
- Behavior that disrupts the functioning of the organization or its events.
- Actions in violation of UC San Diego's student conduct policies.

All grounds for removal must comply with UC San Diego's non-discrimination policies. Allegations of harassment, discrimination, or other student misconduct must be referred to the appropriate university departments. Final decisions regarding member and officer removal will be made with the Figma for Education team.

ARTICLE VII. RISK MANAGEMENT

Figma at UC San Diego at UC San Diego is a registered student organization at the University of California, San Diego, but not part of the University itself.
